Community Garden Update

Plant, Plant! Register for the Community Garden

It's time to think gardening. Join the Valley Ridge Community Garden group and enjoy camaraderie, great gardening tips, and the yummy taste of vegetables you grew yourself!

Registration for a community garden box opened on Monday, February 5, 2024. You can likely still register for a garden box.

- Log onto the VRCA website: www.vrca.community.
- Click on 'About the VRCA' and then 'Community Garden' and follow the prompts.

The garden boxes rent for \$35/season. For liability reasons, you must also hold a VRCA membership at a cost of \$35 for a year. You can buy your membership when you register for a garden box.

Once registration is full for all the available boxes, the system will not allow more. You will not be able to access the registration on the website. If this happens, you can have your name placed on a waitlist in case someone cancels (by emailing garden@vrca.community).

What do I receive when I rent a garden box?

You have use of your garden box for the season. The box comes with excellent soil.

- The Garden Volunteer Core Group arranges for free compost and mulch and will let you know when it is available for you to put on your box.
- You may add your own compost (or other amendments) to your box, but it must be ORGANIC.

What if I want to rent a second box?

You may place your name on a wait list to rent a second box (for an additional rental fee, volunteer role, and watering week).

A few tips for this year's garden

Gardening experts are predicting warmer weather and less rain in Calgary for 2024. For the best results, they suggest:

- Start with great soil high in organic content. This type of soil absorbs water.
- Seed cold weather plants earlier and enjoy harvests in early May. Plant lettuce, spinach, arugula.

- Invest in a soil thermometer to know the temperature of your garden soil.
- Check the City of Calgary compost program for free compost through a booked appointment. Information for 2024 should be available soon. https://www.calgary. ca/waste/residential/green-cart-compost-giveaway.html
- Water deeply and in the early mornings.

Burns and Scalds

Emergency Medical Services routinely respond to Emergencies involving children who have sustained burns or scalds. These incidents often occur inside the child's own home. Common causes include a child accidentally tipping hot liquids onto themselves, touching hot surfaces (stove, iron), or making contact with electrical outlets. Fortunately, incidents such as these can be avoided by taking preventative measures.

Degrees of burn

- 1°: Affects only the top layers of the skin; appears red like a sun burn; discomfort is generally tolerable;
- 2°: Deeper and much more painful than 1°burns; broken skin or blisters commonly develop;
- 3°: Severe: the deepest layers of skin and tissue are injured; may appear charred or leathery.

First Aid for burns

Skin may continue to burn if not cooled.
 Immediately douse burns with large amounts of cold water.

- Cover the burn with a sterile dressing, or at least clean material to protect infection;
- Over the counter medications may be used for pain. Adhere to directions given on the label;
- Seek further medical attention, as required.

Prevention of burns

- Check the temperature of your hot water tank.
 Temperatures as high as 60°C / 140°F will scald a child in just seconds;
- Use placemats instead of tablecloths. Tablecloths can be yanked downward causing hot drinks or food to spill on a child;
- Turn pot handles to the back of the stove and ensure cords from kettles, slow cookers, and other electrical appliances cannot be reached;
- Avoid picking up a child while holding any hot liquids;
- Ensure electrical outlets are made secure by installing commercially available safety devices which prohibit access, if not already built in;
- Keep children away from areas where appliances are in use (kettles, irons, hot stoves).

Councillor Report

Hello Ward 1! Here's the latest news affecting your city and your community:

Drought conditions

Last summer was dry, and it has been another dry winter for the most part. In order to protect our ecosystems and drinking water supply, The City may once again need to put water restrictions in place this spring. Taking steps year-round to reduce water consumption can help reduce the impact of drought and reduce the need for restrictions. Learn more at calgary.ca/droughtresilience.

Blanket rezoning

On April 22, Councill will hold a public hearing on changing the zoning of single-family properties across the city to the "R-CG" district. This would allow the construction of townhouses or duplexes on most residential properties in Calgary without an individual hearing before Council.

I'll be hosting an information session specifically for Ward 1 residents on March 11 to answer your questions and gather your feedback. You can register for this event and find more information at calgary.ca/ward1.

Property assessment

River Valleys Project

The Government of Alberta recently released new draft flood hazard maps for the Bow and Elbow Rivers. These maps are used by The City to inform how land is used in areas that could be affected by flooding. The City will be updating its policies related to flooding and land use later this year. While these policies affect all Calgarians, they are especially important residents of low-lying areas like Bowness in Ward 1. Learn more at calgary.ca/rivervalleys.

St. Sylvester News
